Letters have been sent to member congregations and individuals requesting their continued support of the Council's ministry. We have had our Fall Banquet and the annual Musical Celebration, both of which were great successes. But of course, the need continues as we move toward the end of one year and into the start of another. You should know that as of this writing we have dispersed the local share of this year's Crop Walk Funds, \$21,787, to 23 food pantries and 10 soup kitchens in Albany County. The Emergency Shelter is open and running every night and will continue to the end of April.

My task as Interim Director becomes clearer as the days go along: represent the Council at various meetings and events, be part of the ongoing ministry that is the CACC, and to observe, ask questions, and make comments when appropriate.
