CWS is assisting refugees and responding to natural disasters around the world. Many thanks to all who participated in the 10 Capital Region CROP Walks on May 4. Final figures from the Albany Walk show around 450 walkers/volunteers from 54 groups. Income, including a \$750 grant from Thrivent and some generous matching funds, is just under \$93,000. One-quarter of the funds raised will come back to this area to help local food pantries and soup kitchens.
