Preliminary figures from the Albany Walk show 450 walkers/volunteers from 50 different groups. \$48,000 was turned in on Walk Day. With \$14,104 posted in on-line donations, plus additional income turned in to our office, the income to date is \$73,000. By the time all outstanding pledges and matching funds have come in, we hope to end up with \$80,000-\$85,000.
