CWS is assisting refugees and responding to natural disasters around the world. Many thanks to all who participated in the 10 Capital Region CROP Walks on May 4. Preliminary figures from the Albany Walk show 450 walkers/volunteers from 50 different groups. \$45,791 was turned in on Walk Day. With over \$27,000 posted in on-line donations, plus additional income turned in to our office, the income as of June 16 was nearing \$88,000. By the time all outstanding pledges and matching funds have come in, we hope to come close to our goal of \$100,000.
