## **Don't Forget to Vote**

The Action & Program Commission reminds you to exercise your democratic right to vote on November 5. In addition to city and town contests, there are several statewide propositions. One of them is New York Casino Gambling Amendment, Proposal 1, regarding the authorization of casinos in areas other than non-Native American tribal lands. There has been considerable debate about the language of the proposition as it appears on the ballot, so we urge you to learn as much as you can about this issue and the other propositions before you vote.

#### **Homelessness/Shelter News**

November is "Homelessness Awareness Month". The CACC Emergency Overflow Shelter opens Nov. 15 and will operate 7 nights a week, from 7pm-7am, until the last week of April. Hot meals, clean clothing, showers, toiletries, and referrals to appropriate services will be provided to up to 19 male guests per night. If you have collected any of the items from last month's wish list, call the CACC office (462-5450) to arrange for drop off.

Volunteers are needed during the evening (6-10pm) to help with laundry, making beds, greeting guests, etc. Call the Shelter phone (426-1227) and leave a message for Pam and she will get back to you.

There will be an Open House at the Shelter from 5-6:30pm on Tuesday, Nov. 12, for those who wish to tour the facility before we open for the season.

If your congregation, youth group, or service organization is looking for a project, why not organize a special event to benefit the Shelter? Host a supper, a car wash, an "undie Sunday" collection, or some other activity. Be creative!
