# From the Executive Director "Churches and Cabarets"

Recently the Albany Common Council passed a new ordinance that requires a permit for certain musical events in public places, including churches. It has been referred to in the press as "*The Cabaret Ordinance*". The final text was less restrictive than the original but, it passed before churches could adequately consult with each other and voice their concerns. The basic concern is whether churches should be included in this ordinance at all. Six months from now the Common Council will review the matter again.

I anticipate that many of our CACC member churches will want an opportunity to talk about this issue and I invite you to make your wishes known. There also might be other concerns that the churches should be discussing. In either case, I would be happy to convene a meeting.

In times past we often discussed issues like this at a noontime gathering but, we discontinued that when attendance declined. Please contact the CACC office (462-5450) to suggest days and times that work best for you.

# **CROP Hunger Walks-May 6**

We invite you to join us in "Ending Hunger—One Step at a Time" and help our "Communities Respond to Overcome Poverty". Hundreds of people of all ages will collect pledges and walk in one of the ten CROP Walks taking place in the greater Capital District that day. The Albany CROP Walk will be dedicated to the memory of the late Rev. John U. Miller, former Executive Director of the Council of Churches. The Walk begins and ends at First Lutheran Church, 181 Western Ave. Registration begins at 12:30pm. Following a musical performance and brief opening remarks, walkers will step off at 1:30pm. Choosing between a 4.5 mile loop (with 3

rest stops along the way) or the "Golden Mile", walkers will put their faith in action to help hungry people. Refreshments at First Lutheran after the walk.

Want to get involved? Walk--with a group from your house of worship, business, community organization, or your family. Sponsor a walker--25% of the money raised comes back to the Capital District to help our neighbors in need and the remainder is used for hunger relief and development projects around the world.
